Strategic Goal I: Professional Development

Objective: Increase accessibility of professional development resources.

Strategies:

- 1. Reach out to school district leaders and provide information regarding the importance of professional development for their food and nutrition staff.
 - a. Send letters to superintendents outlining the importance of continued education and information about joining the association if they are not already members.
- 2. Regional directors will contact district directors in their area inviting them to participate in local and state meetings and conferences.

Strategic Goal II: Advocacy and Public image

Objective: Educate stakeholders of the importance and value of the school nutrition programs.

Strategies:

- 1. Newsletters to parents outlining school nutrition efforts and information regarding the meal programs.
- 2. Encourage districts to invite legislatures to visit their cafeterias.
- 3. Encourage nutrition professionals to attend LAC and contact local representatives.

Strategic Goal III: Membership & Community

Objective: Increase membership, retention and involvement in MSNA

Strategies:

- 1. Promote participation in MSNA and SNA programs, trainings, grants, scholarships, and awards.
- 2. Assure nutrition professionals are aware of regional and state conferences by email and newsletters.
- 3. Highlight school nutrition professionals on social media, local news, district and state level recognition.

Strategic Goal IV: Governance & Operations

Objective: Enhance processes and practices and structures to contribute to a sustainable and robust Association.

Strategies:

- 1. Challenge members to reach out to a nearby district and invite them to attend meetings and talk to them about what benefits they gain from being a member.
